## PLANNING APPEALS

**24/00006/REF, 38 High Street:** Change of use from B8 Storage to E(g)(i) Offices and change of existing flat roof to pitch roof and adjoining façade.

D24/51 The Committee RESOLVED to oppose the appeal on the following grounds:

- (a) The original application was refused due to its impact on protected trees within the grounds of Winslow Hall, and it appears that the appellant has sought to avoid the issues by cutting back the trees, so far as WTC is aware without planning consent.
- (b) WTC continues to assert that the site provides insufficient on-site parking to meet the requirements of VALP Policy T6. The presence of a nearly public car park should not be used to justify departure from Policy T6, and cannot logically be used to do so without an assessment of availability of parking spaces at all relevant times.
- D24/52 The Committee RESOLVED that the Clerk should refer the cutting back of the protected trees to planning enforcement.
